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**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

**MAYOR/SAFETY:** Mayor Radeff reports on Dunkle Day, this kind of started with the group of people who had come to me and asked if it was something we'd be interested in in getting a committee together, and it's all volunteers and different organizations, but also different citizens, and obviously Steve's involved as a councilman, and I just want to give them props for the work they've done. They've been meeting for over a year now to kind of put this together, and they've even got some of the county administration involved in this, and I know that there's going to be some write-ups in the newspaper about it, so obviously this is also something dear to Steve's heart, because I know that Steve and the old service director, Lenny Smith, kind of started the whole Dunkle appreciation type of thing. It's something we're really excited for, and obviously we're hoping that everything goes well and we can continue to kind of make it an event for the city every single year. As for the notification

system, I know that Councilwoman Gee had asked about that. We should have a quote soon from Joran who runs our website, and we'll be able to hopefully move forward with that sooner rather than later. Again, that's so that we can send out text messages and notifications to the citizens who sign up, so we can keep them informed of what's going on if things are happening. It's also hopefully will be a two-way system as well. We do have the ability for people to comment on our website now if they have issues or concerns, but I think this might be a little faster way, but we're excited to get that moving. The last thing is for motorized bikes and scooters, I know the weather's getting nice, and I know every year that tends to be a topic. Chief Kory and Law Director Ward and I have met already, and hopefully we should have an ordinance together for an ordinance committee hopefully the next meeting, just a sample draft so we can start talking about that and having something solid. As we've said before, motorized bikes and scooters are kind of a new thing, and some of our ordinances are old, so modernizing some of that to properly fit the different types of motorized scooters and bikes because they're all different sizes, shapes, speeds. We just want to make sure that we're dealing with that appropriately. Councilwoman Gee says I know we're looking into hiring someone at the fire dept. Originally, when we had our discussion on the budget, we were also going to be hiring someone for PD. Is there any idea when that's going to happen? Mayor Radeff responds first, we are going to have an open spot in fire because we have a gentleman retiring. After that, then we'll start moving forward with those 2 options. We tried to budget both of them, so as long as Corey says it's feasible, then we're going to move forward. \*Motion by Gee/Second by Cizl to accept the report. Yeas All. /**SERVICE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:** Service Director Hastings reports in addition to the construction going on on Walker Rd., Pleasant View, and Cove Beach, you will see mobilization on St. Rt. 6, Lake Rd., between roughly Buckeye Ave. and Cove Beach to start removing trees that are in the cities right away. I have been in touch with a couple companies on the annual dredging of our boat launch. There's a limited group of companies that do that, so we are on their schedule and hope to have that done by April 15th. Councilman DeBottis says a resident called me and said that she thought there was a possible grant for emergency sirens for the city for bad weather. Service Director Hastings replies yeah, we've done a lot of work on that, councilman, including with former director Freeman at the Emergency Management Agency. They actually recommend against those sirens, and I'd be happy to share his narrative with you. Mayor Radeff says this comes up every year and that's been his recommendation every time. Councilman Morrow says I had a constituent come up to me and ask me about, he said that there was some sort of policy. I think it was that there was a policy for charging houses that got sold an escrow amount for sidewalks, and then he was saying that the sidewalks have never been built and that the city's sitting on a pile of cash for sidewalks that it hasn't used. I just wanted to see what the take was if that did exist or not exist. Service Director Hastings replies yeah, there is an escrow requirement if you have a sale with a structure on it, a home, and we did do about \$225,000 in sidewalks over the last 2 years. We've been building that amount up to pass the threshold for a competitive bid so that the city gets the best rate, and that is going out to bid this year, which I'll have in front of council at the next council meeting in April. It's about \$87,000 in there currently. I intend to

exhaust all of that money this year. President Rosso says just an FYI, over the years, one of the problems is you sell a house to get an occupancy, they've got to either put the money in escrow or sidewalk. So, they put in escrow. Well, now you look for somebody to put in a sidewalk and you've got a house over here, you've got a house in this block, and nobody wants to bid on it. Councilman Fogel says I've talked to two different concrete contractors that both said that they didn't have a problem if it was spread apart in different areas. Service Director Hastings says I intend to have that and our annual bid which includes stone aggregates, fuel, etc. Councilwoman Gee asks could you briefly touch on Beautification Day? Service Director Hastings responds May 16th, we'll open our service dept. up and we provide paper shredding for the residents. We have dumpsters here for the residents. If you're a senior and you call in advance, we can arrange to pick up some of your heavy items. We typically don't go in the house, though. We do have coordination with about 50 Boy Scouts this year. People who want to volunteer to spread mulch under the parks and so forth are certainly welcome as well as beach cleanup. We run that from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Councilman Kovach asks what objects are not collected? Service Director Hastings replies anything flammable. If it's paint, you have to open your can and put kitty litter in it or something to absorb that. Propane, we don't accept. Tires, we do not accept. Electronics, we do not accept. All of these things, however, can be taken to the Lorain County Recycle Center, which is in Elyria. I believe we put that in our newsletter from time to time.

\*Motion by Gee/Second by Cizl to accept the report. Yeas All. /**FINANCE DIRECTORS REPORT**: Finance Director Rummell reports Mr. Morrow did do a presentation over the 3 finance software's that we looked at, and I think Mr. Morrow, Mrs. Gee, and I are all in agreement that UAN is the best option. It is recommended by the auditor of the state. It will be cheaper for the city, and I previously used it, so the learning curve will be a little bit lower for me, and I should be able to then teach it to the staff for them. So, we'll be proceeding with that, hopefully, in the very near future. During the last meeting, we were asked about fire truck specs, and I believe that the fire chief sent those. I did reach out to both the police chief and the fire chief to find out what type of equipment that they needed, what was outdated, and I intend to have a full report for you by the safety meeting, so that way, if there are any questions on that, both the police chief and the fire chief will be able to answer that. Then, the Flock cameras, with regard to that, for year number 1, it'll cost \$21,500 for that. Now, the breakdown of that is 6 cameras throughout the city. Each camera is about \$3,000. Then, the enhanced license plate registration is \$3,500. So, altogether, that comes out to the \$21,500. I will say that, as a caveat, that that does come for year 1 with a \$3,900 discount. So, in year 2, if that pricing remains the same, then we would be at \$25,400 for year 2. Last but not least, I have been asked a few times, Mr. Morrow, in particular, had asked me about the investment committee. With the investment committee, I know that former finance director Smith, did periodic updates on that. I have not done that. So, moving forward, we will be doing quarterly updates for investments. For right now, our main investment is Star, Ohio, which is an account that we do put money into and it is interest-bearing on there. I do not have the numbers for that in front of me right now, but if you ask, I can always get those for you. Council 12 and 13 are both ordinances that I put forth last

session. Once again, number 12 is a grant that was received by the fire. We already have the money for that. Number 13 is an OWDA reimbursement, much the same as I said last time with an OWDA and Council Number 3 and 4. So, this is just putting the money back that we've already received. Councilman DeBottis asks as far as the Flock cameras, if this were to pass, do we have the money in the budget to pay for these every year? Finance Director Rummell replies I think that definitely moving forward, we would have the money in the budget because we would definitely budget for it. I think this year we would probably have to look at some of the lines, make a few cuts and move things around. But yes, we should have the money for that. Councilman Morrow asks is there any discount for having more of them? Instead of 6 or 8, we went to 10? Is there a big discount? Finance Director Rummell replies I can check with the police chief. \*Motion by Gee/Second by Cizl to accept the report. Yeas All. /**LAW DIRECTORS REPORT:** Law Director Ward has no report. Councilman Morrow asks I believe we asked you to investigate, evaluate Westlaw Co-Council. Are you still in the process of doing that? Law Director Ward responds I don't have any issue with making that part of the city's plan, but I don't know what the increase would be. Mayor Radeff replies we do a contract with them so it's not even something we would be able to consider this year. we just signed a contract with Westlaw, so it's not something we're jumping to right now. I mean, I think Pat will tell you it's more than sufficient where we're at with our Westlaw account.

**CITIZENS COMMENTARY:** *Rob Lascola, 4215 Holl Ave.* says I am here today, because this guy put a bunch of names of minors on his page without any parental consent. So, I would like to find out exactly how he got those names. You said there was a public record. So, I would like to know, did the mayor or anybody on this council make those kids' names public to him for him to use? President Rosso replies they filled out a survey which became part of the city's public record. Mr. Morrow made a public records request to see those surveys. Law Director Ward states the names were part of the survey. Mayor Radeff states on the survey, they had to just give a name and an email address so we could filter to make sure people are filling them out that live in the city. At no point were we ever going to release those names. We didn't want to release those names. He put a public records request in. You can ask the law director, we had a very extensive conversation about it. I was not exactly happy with it but obviously I have to respect the law and if we have to provide those, but as for the releasing of those names, that had nothing to do with the city. Mr. Lascola replies it had nothing to do with the city, good to know, but it kinda did because it was him. Parents are here because they are upset. Councilman Morrow asks if he can respond. President Rosso says you only get 3 minutes whether they are used up talking to the audience or Jon talking back to you. Councilman Fogel says he would like to make a motion to extend his time. Mr. Lascola says because you are upset with him, you are releasing these names. What gave you the right to do that? I understand your issues with him and that's fine. But what gives you the right to release these kids' names? We live in a world where political retribution is real and you thought it was a good idea to release kids' names. Councilman Morrow replies I didn't do anything political. Mr. Lascola replies this was political. You were using it to target him. Councilman Morrow responds No, I wasn't. Mr. Lascola asks are

we allowed to swear in these meetings, because this dude's a dipsh-. You were using that and those kids' names and that survey as political against him. You are accusing him of using these kids to pad the survey. Councilman Morrow replies those records were publicly available and any sexual predator could have requested that. Mr. Lascola says and you gave ammo to them. You gave them age, grade, and you gave them their name. Do you not understand that? You posted minors' names without parental consent. Councilman Morrow responds there's no parental consent needed.

*Megan O'Shea* (no address given) states I have 3 children that go to the school district. I am under the impression that there was a permission slip signed prior to the survey. Mayor Radeff says the conversation is I talked to the history teacher and he said he would like his kids to fill it out. He worked with the school. Ms. O'Shea asks do you have a copy of the permission slip and was that limited to use (inaudible) public dissemination? Mayor Radeff replies anything like that has to go through the school. President Rosso says I had a discussion with superintendent Clark today and his statement/position is at the beginning of every school year parents sign some form that allows their students to take certain types of surveys, nothing personal like information, but this would have fallen under that approval. Ms. O'Shea asks for school use or public records use? I signed a consent for the school and the school only. I did not sign a consent for the City of Sheffield Lake to disseminate my minor child. President Rosso replies but they did it in a school classroom. Ms. O'Shea asks the survey was intended for the students to fill out that was eventually used in city planning purposes or whatever? Mayor Radeff responds yeah, the statistics were, not the individual names. Ms. O'Shea asks I'm assuming that multiple demographics were surveyed? Mayor Radeff replies correct. Ms. O'Shea asks was that information also disclosed by you? Councilman Morrow asks what information? Ms. O'Shea responds all of the survey participants. Was that disclosed on your personal Facebook page? Councilman Morrow replies no. Ms. O'Shea replies oh, just the minors. Councilman Morrow states just the ones where the appearance of the law was broken. Ms. O'Shea says I'm assuming the proper procedures were not followed, because we are not protecting and redacting minors' information including emails. I would like to know what procedures in the future will be enforced so that we don't have our minor student's information being disseminated, disclosed for public use on a public Facebook page for anybody to find. Mayor Radeff replies first of all, I apologize, because at no point did I ever think that this was going to be an issue. We did the survey. We wanted to get a large variety of people from the city so we can have the best results, because obviously we use this for the master plan. It hadn't been done in over 20 years. The goal was to get a good representation so we knew what to do with parks, rec, etc. The school said yeah, we would love the kids to do it. I even went and spoke with seniors at their breakfast. Some of the seniors at the time had already done it and especially knowing that the 8th graders now would be 10th graders, they're gonna be working soon. They'll be paying taxes so they should have a say.

*Mary Cantu, 935 East Dr.* states my child was one of the names listed on that. I do have here my signed consent saying I don't give consent for anything. So, if their using it for things, where's their proof that us parents gave them that permission? When you are going out filling our grants for these surveys, are you letting these folks know for the grants that you are surveying minors to get the money? I spoke to the teacher as well that administered it and he said these kids if they partook in it, got extra credit. Then they were enticed to do the

survey. What as parents can we do? He posted the names on his personal page, not the city page, which he didn't have the right to do. As parents, we didn't give permission for this. Where do we go to keep this from happening again? Councilman Morrow replies the school should have let you know that this was a public survey and that there was potential for it to become public. If you signed no and they still did it, then it's the school's fault. Back and forth yelling from the audience. Ms. Cantu says it's just an ethical thing. What idiot puts kids out there? Do you want that done to you? To your kids? Councilman Morrow responds my kids are on Facebook. They're not minors now, but I wouldn't have cared back then. Ms. Cantu replies oh, really? Good parenting buddy.

*Amy Forkins, 996 Lakewood Beach Dr.* asks did you get consent from the parents of the 82 students names that you posted? Councilman Morrow replies I didn't have too; it's a public survey. Why'd you let your child take a public survey? Ms. Forkins asks did you consult with the school about the parents who signed the do not post my kids' picture and name, because there are certain situations like adoptions, fostering, etc., where you can't post names and pictures. You violated those rights when you posted the names and class of 2028. My kids on that and you didn't ask me. Councilman Morrow replies it's all publicly available. Ms. Forkins replies no, it's not. I signed consent for the school, not for you. You violated my rights. Councilman Morrow replies and you allowed your child to take that. You allowed your child to take a public survey. Ms. Forkins says I would like to ask you today on March 24<sup>th</sup> to resign, to step down. Councilman Morrow responds no. Ms. Forkins states your behavior on social media, cussing out your constituents and other members running for office, not professional. Posting this information, legal or not, it's morally improper. Everything you've done up until today has not been morally proper. You don't cuss out the people that you represent. You don't post the names of the parents that you represent. You ask me, the parent of a now sophomore for my permission. Councilman Morrow asks how would I know you were their parent? Ms. Forkins replies you didn't ask. Councilman Morrow replies I'm not allowed to by law. Ms. Forkins says the proper way if you wanted to know who is in Sheffield Lake, who is in Sheffield Village, call up the school and say "Mr. Cook, I want to know who lives in Sheffield Village and who lives in Sheffield Lake?" Councilman Morrow asks why were the students taking this anyhow? (inaudible).

*Jennifer Gabet*, says the storm drain on the north side of Hawthorne, it's been filled with cement. I've lived there for 15+years, can someone just check that out? The south end of Thelma cones are there, road work was done there, when will those cones and pavement be done? Service Director Hastings replies the asphalt plant is not open yet. Ms. Gabet says I strongly recommend going to walking with the mayor, coffee with the mayor because even if you don't disagree with him, we sat there for a long time talking and he is telling me all the plans he has for the city. Everyone's out complaining, but won't go talk to him. I was the only one there. It's sad, y'all are sad. The survey, did the council have any involvement in creating the survey, including what questions were asked and how and to whom the information was disseminated to? Can a new survey be created even if it's not incorporated into the master plan? Can a new survey be done? Is it your goal to say that based on the potential flawed survey, that the city should not have applied for and been awarded grant money for anything contained in the master plan, such as the field house? If so, by implying that, are you not in fear of future grant requests being denied or any other requests all because you don't want a field house? So, if you're like oh, that survey was flawed so that

means the master plan was flawed, that means the grant was flawed and they're going to take that grant away so any future requests that the city makes, you're jeopardizing that. Do you not understand that? Student's names, I find that Mr. Morrow's post regarding student's names is ignorant and disrespectful no matter if he legally obtained the information. I see that the post has been taken down, because you allegedly got your information. Disrespectful and fu-ing rude. Actions of members of this council continue to make the city look like a joke. You all need to do better. I would like council to consider some sort of reprimand or censure of Mr. Morrow. If council is not willing to do that, then I hold all of you, all of you responsible for the actions of this one member.

*Patty Gascoyne, 856 Irving Park Blvd.* states I am married to Jon Morrow. Let me tell you Jon is a marine and he does swear a lot. Unfortunately, that is a flaw. I have to live with that every day. God bless him he's got a backbone and when he smells potential fraud, he wants to get to the bottom of it. Now, he does everything by the book, up one side and down the other. He comes on strong, because he's a strong man. The public records that he waited 3 months for, no one suspected a bunch of kids, minors, 83/82 of them were among the 400. That's a significant portion of the community surveys taken, with which these grants were applied for and money was spent on already for a project that council has not approved. So, I'm glad the concerned parents are here. I'm glad you're concerned. I'm sorry your kids took a public survey. They should not have and if that was okay with you, those results should not have been included in the grant application as a foundation. Oh, the community wants this. Well, these are kids. If they were enticed to take a survey for extra credit and then these results, these data points were used as evidence that this is what the community wants, then that should have been brought forward on day one with transparency. The basic methodology of the survey, any study has a control group. It all should be explained and up front and transparent. What portion of the population are homeowners? How many are renters? How many are in this age bracket, this socioeconomic group? None of that was even brought forward. So, this is just one symptom of a big problem that someone has the guts to investigate and he's like a bulldog, he's not going to give up. I'm sorry y'all are offended, but there's a profound problem here and ultimately his work is going to protect you, your tax dollars, your children and their future, and their potential to have jobs closer to home if they want them.

*Gary Tollett, 4137 Holl Ave.* says I'm not here about a survey or anything like that. I'm more here about the pride in our city. I'd like to see it come back. I'd like to see all the bickering stop between city council. It looks like a bunch of children arguing on Facebook all the time; that our kids are saying, that our whole community is saying, that other communities are saying. I'd like to see a bunch of adults band together and find a way to make our city what it once was. I haven't lived here my whole life. I grew up in a pretty rough part of Elyria. My wife is from Sheffield. We moved here 15 years ago, because I had a lot of pride in it. I thought it was a great city. It was safe. I didn't worry about crime. I didn't worry about my kids being thugs or gangsters. That's what made Sheffield Lake great and I think I'd like to see a bunch of adults come back together and make it like that again instead of arguing all the time. That's kind of my take. That's with talking with neighbors, friends, family. I think we've got a great community. I'm proud of it. I think a lot of people are proud of it, but everybody's got these different agendas and I'd love to see some people come together and

be real adults and talk it out behind closed doors like adults do, instead of on social media and bullsh- like that.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** Councilman DeBottis asks when Mr. Morrow continuously asked for the public records request, I know there were some different excuses given. First, they didn't exist, they were destroyed, I think. So, finally when you agreed to give those to Mr. Morrow, I guess my first question to you is, did you know that there were minors on that survey before you turned over the public records to Mr. Morrow? Law Director Ward replies first of all, your summary of the history of the city's responses to Councilman Morrow's various requests is not entirely accurate, but it's not really appropriate to nail that down here it's not productive either. The records were produced pursuant to Mr. Morrow's records requests in accordance with what the city is required to turn over under Ohio's public records law. Councilman DeBottis asks again, did you have knowledge that there were minor children on these surveys before you turned them loose? I guess that's just a yes or no. Law Director Ward responds I compiled the records and I turned them over. I did not investigate to determine the ages of people who took the survey. Councilman DeBottis asks if you would have known that there were minor, because I did not know. None of the council knew. If you would have known that there were minor children on that survey, would you have redacted the names and then given them to Mr. Morrow? Law Director Ward replies the Ohio's public records act does not require a redaction in that scenario. Councilman DeBottis asks but could you have redacted the names and then warned us that there were minor children on that survey? Law Director Ward replies I'm required to respond to a public records request in accordance with Ohio law. Councilman Morrow says we were going to talk about the dog ordinance. The vicious dog ordinance got changed and then we were gonna bring up about potentially changing that to vicious animal ordinance. Mayor Radeff replies we just passed the vicious dog ordinance, but starting the end of this year there is Avery's Law. So, that's something that we have to review, because now it narrows; there's 3 classifications from vicious, dangerous and nuisance dog and obviously we can't not follow that law. So, we're going to have to sit down and it applies to dogs only. It doesn't apply to cats or any animals. Obviously, that can be considered. I'm not sure of any other animals that we've had issues with. President Rosso asks in review to bring us up into line with Avery's Law, we can address other animals? Mayor Radeff replies absolutely. Councilman Morrow asks what's the timeline on that? Mayor Radeff replies we have a list of priorities and we will get to it. I can't give you a date. We have a lot of things we are working on.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Councilwoman Gee says there's been some posts on social media and I received one phone call in regards to the violations of trash being thrown out, littering from Abby Rd. west on Walker. Through the years on Pride Day, that was always a very bad area of ditch to clean out. It's not from someone's trash can being blown by the wind, it has always been a litter haven. Is there anyway we could start with having a sign there letting them know there is a fine for littering? There's gotta be a way we can try to stop these people somewhat. Mayor Radeff replies we do have cameras in public areas throughout the city. I don't think we have anything on that specifically. There's gonna be some significant

work done over on Abbe and Walker this year, so we can incorporate that in the plans too on figuring out if a camera's appropriate or not.

\*Motion by Kovach/Second by Cizl to approve the recommendation from the Planning Commission regarding Harbor Woods concept plan.

ROLL CALL: Kovach, Cizl, Gee, Fogel, Morrow, DeBottis, Petrucci. Yeas All.

Councilman Morrow says I have a couple constituents that had asked about the seating in the council chambers, about it being uncomfortable and getting worn out. I'd like to talk about that at the next work session if that would be proper and appropriate. I had another constituent ask about the city job postings to be advertised on the official city website. I think when officer Antonio did his life saving efforts, I just thought that I wanted to make a motion that we get him like a \$100 gift certificate or \$150 gift certificate for a steakhouse or something like that, because I just figured what he did was go above and beyond the call of duty there and that just a paper proclamation to me just didn't seem fitting. That's a motion. Mayor Radeff says I don't think we can legally do that. Finance Director Rummell states it will be over De Minimis. Councilman Morrow says I want to move to convene a special session as a committee of the whole to conduct a fact-finding review regarding the administration methodology and controls of the Sheffield Lake Community Survey including participation criteria and respondent verification. President Rosso replies the council doesn't have the right to call council meetings. Only the mayor and the president. It's council rule #2. I'd be happy to talk to you about it. Creating a policy for approved projects which is tabled, do we just want to leave it tabled or do we want to untable it tonight? Decision made to leave tabled.
